__28. As a way of funding road improvements and maintenance in Michigan, Governor Whitmer has proposed increasing the gas tax by 45 cents per gallon. As an alternative to an increase in the gas tax, one approach suggested is to amend the Michigan Constitution to increase the state sales tax by 1 and one-half cents on the dollar, which would increase the state sales tax from 6 to 7.5 cents. If approved by voters, it would raise an estimated \$2.5 billion per year, with all of the increased funding dedicated to funding road improvements and repairs. Knowing this, if the election were held today, would you vote yes in favor of increasing the state sales tax by 1.5 cents to fund road improvements in Michigan, or, would you vote “no” to oppose the proposal?

[IF UNDECIDED, ASK: “Well, if the election were held today and you had to decide tight now, would you lean toward voting “yes” or lean toward voting “no?” AND CODE BEST RESPONSE]
