## Q. 19 was commissioned by Gongwer News Service

__19. This year, a new law was passed by the Legislature and signed by Governor Snyder which increased the powers of state-appointed emergency financial managers who are assigned to manage local governments or school districts experiencing severe financial problems. Under the new law, until the financial emergency has been resolved, the law transfers all powers from local elected or appointed officials to the emergency financial manager, who has the ultimate authority to void all contracts with employees, or to actually dissolve the local government or school district if the Governor approves. If enough valid petition signatures are collected to require a referendum on this new law, there may be a proposal placed on the November election ballot in 2012 to allow voters to decide to either keep or reject this new law. If a referendum proposal is placed on the ballot, would you vote "yes" to keep the law, or would you vote "no" to reject it?

__20. On February $28^{\text {th }}$ next year, Michigan is scheduled to hold a statewide presidential primary election, which will cost an estimated $\$ 10$ million. The Michigan Democratic Party has already decided to select their delegates to their national convention by using a caucus process, as they have in the past, which they will fund, and to not use a publicly funded presidential primary election. The Michigan Republican Party is currently deciding whether they will use a caucus process, similar to what the Democratic Party will use, or, if they will use the presidential primary election. If a presidential primary is held just for the Michigan Republican Party to select their delegates to their national convention, they will likely have a closed primary election that requires voters to declare that they are Republicans. Should a presidential primary election be held in Michigan next year for one political party, or, should the presidential primary election be cancelled next year, thereby requiring both parties to use a caucus process for delegate selection, which would be funded by each political party?
